This Geographic Full-Time (GFT) appointment is at the rank of Assistant Professor in the Rady Faculty of Health Sciences, Max Rady College of Medicine. Remuneration is commensurate with qualifications and experience.

- Primary practice sites include Health Sciences Centre (HSC) and CancerCare Manitoba
- Secondary responsibilities at St. Boniface General Hospital and Victoria General Hospital
- Participation in Otolaryngology–Head & Neck Surgery on-call coverage as part of a collegial team supporting the province's largest tertiary care hospital
- Practice within a program offering a rich mix of emergent and elective Otolaryngology–Head & Neck Surgery
